Prof. Dr. Pirzada Qasim Raza Siddiqui, Vice Chancellor, ZU, said ultimate objective of such event is to create awareness on importance of rehabilitation and its modern implication. He said Ziauddin University is aiming towards achieving excellence in the field of research on neurosciences and rehabilitation.

Prof. Dr. Abbas Zafar, Dean faculty of health sciences congratulated the organizers for selecting such an important and unrecognized topic and believed that this is the first conference of its kind on the topic of Rehabilitation in Pakistan.

Prof. Dr. Talat Mirza, Conference Chair & Dean Research, ZU in her introduction to the conference stated that today's event is a multidisciplinary program which involved many stake holders related to the rehabilitation and she emphasized that University is fully equipped with all the resources to host such a mega event. The National & International scholars interacted very effectively in relevance to cutting edge research and recent advances in this subject area.

Speaking about Rehabilitation and its importance, Dr. Wasti, the vice president of World Federation for Neuro Rehabilitation Gulf region, said that rehabilitation as part of disease management or care of the infirm was as old as human life itself. U.S has over 11,000 board certified physiotherapits, who work in complete coordination and commitment for rehabilitation. Moreover, it is important to mention here that despite a much bigger population, Pakistan at present lacked certified experts in comparison to that of United States in the field of rehabilitation.

Rehabilitation can prevent a lot that is associated with disease

as secondary loss. It can improve outcome and increase patient and family satisfaction, he said. He insisted, medical rehabilitation should form core element of all treated protocols and is essential for those patients receiving advanced neurological, cardiac, pulmonary, cancer and trauma care. Pakistan needs to invest in medical rehabilitation, now a front end clinical specialty and a core element of all treatment protocols, said Dr. Sabahat Wasti, an expert on neurorehabilitation, during his presentation at international conference organized at Ziauddin University.

In Ziauddin memorial lecture on "Recovery and Rehabilitation in Addiction" Prof. Muhammad Adeel Parvaz, associated with the department of psychiatry and neurosciences, Friedman Brain Institute, New York, said that drug addiction is more a brain disease than a social problem and can be treated like other diseases was preventable and treatable. He elaborated the consequences of drug abuse saying they are wide spread and affect people irrespective of their ages.

Experts said that in Pakistan mental disorders account for more than 4% of the total disease burden, with the mental health burden higher among women. However, allocated resources for the screening and treatment of mental health disorders ae not enough to meet the increasing needs.

The conference was largely attended by the renowned speakers from USA, DUBAI, MALAYSIA and SPAIN, whose thought provoking sessions on rehabilitation were hailed by the audience largely.

'Despite being routinely harassed at public places, especially while travelling on public transport, a majority of women do not lodge a formal report against harassment'

These points were raised at a seminar held at Ziauddin University on Wednesday, 14 March 2018.

"Every woman has a story behind her. Some have the courage to tell it to the world while others lack the confidence to share it even with their family," Prof Khalida Ghaus, the managing director at Social Policy and Development Centre (SPDC), said.

Actress and model Sarwat Gilani urged women 'to speak louder'. "Nobody is going to speak for us except ourselves. We should stop the harasser and learn to say no. Advocate Zia Ahmed Awan spoke about the deeply rooted gender discrimination in society and said that a girl child had to face discrimination even before the child was born.

Psychologist Dr Atia Naqvi urged women to face life's challenges with courage and resilience. "Hold your head high; you have to make yourself strong. Trust your judgment. Don't hide your feelings if you are not comfortable with anyone. Learn to treat yourself with respect otherwise it would be difficult for you to survive in this society."

TOLERANCE IN YOUTH: Ziauddin University hosted a 'ZU Dialogue Program' on the topic of 'Promoting Tolerance in Youth' at Ziauddin University, Clifton campus on January 23, 2018.

Vice Chancellor, Ziauddin University, Dr. Pirzada Qasim Raza Siddiqui, addressing the audience said that active participation of all the factions of the society including the students is predominant in reducing the level of intolerance, anxiety and frustration from the society. It is also the responsibility of the religious scholars to educate the people on the subject of tolerance and acceptance on daily basis, he added.

Speaking to the audience, Barrister Shahida Jamil said that education is the only key through which a tolerant society can be formed. It is the need of the hour to inculcate all such teachings of Islam and Holy Prophet Muhammad (SAW) that truly propagates the message of tolerance, respect, freedom of expression and equality irrespective of any kind of discrimination as it is an undeniable fact that the outcome of prejudice is nothing else than huge destruction. Renowned Psychologist and Assistant Director Pakistan, Institute of Learning and Living (PILL), Dr. Tayyeba Kiran said that the role of parent is pivotal in educating the children in the right direction. From the very initial stage of infancy, parents should teach their children how to control the anger and must refrain from comparing the ability and skills of their children to that of any other relative or friend child, as this will certainly create the element of frustration or lack of enthusiasm in the child. So it is better to instill optimism and assurance among adolescent at every stage. Apart from this, teachers should also try to develop such a healthy environment where students should be well aware of stress management and its consequences.

Founder Chairman, Youth Parliament, Rizwan Jaffar said that for promoting an adequate level of tolerance in the society, it is important that individuals in any capacity should develop a sense of acceptance of values, perceptions and beliefs. He said that the role of government is of utmost importance in this regard as it is evident that whenever there exists a huge failure in the implementation of rule of law the people naturally becomes intolerant and frustrated on account of social injustices and discriminations. It is the dire responsibility of the government as well as the leaders to ensure transparent compliance procedure at every place and should provide all basic amenities to the people that will synonymously play a vital role in reducing the existing wave of aggravation and enragement in the society as well as youth, he added.

The objective of organizing such events in educational institutes is to develop tolerance and patience in the youth and to educate them to avoid the elements of negativity and disapproval.
