SYMPOSIUM HELD TO RAISE AWARENESS OF GYNAECOLOGY & FETOMATERNAL COMPLICATIONS

Ziauddin University organised a full day symposium on March 01, 2015 focusing on the complications of Gynaecology and its treatment.

Prof Rubina Hussain, Chairperson Pakistan Menopause Society and Head of Gynaecology and Obstetrics department Ziauddin University discussed the cognitive problems with menopause. She

said self-reported memory problems are common in perimenopausal women. She advised that regular exercise, social activities, balanced diet and fulfilling life style are helpful in maintaining good cognitive performance.

Mr Sherif Abdul Fattah, Scientific Editor BJOG and MTI Officer at Royal College of Obstetricians & Gynaecologists (RCOG) highlighted application criteria of MTI Programme. He said the College has run MTI scheme for a number of years and currently has over 100 doctors from around 10 different countries in posts across the UK. He stated that one million babies die each year as a result of prematurity. Preterm birth compli-



cations are the leading cause of death among children under five years of age.

Dr Kashif Shazlee, Head of Radiology Department, Dr Ziauddin Hospital spoke on the role of interventional radiology in the management of obstetrical & gynaecological disorders. He said Interventional Radiology (IR) has a great impact on reproductive

health, particularly complications related to pregnancy, childbirth and female fertility. IR embolisation is a safe, reliable and effective treatment option in the management of Postpartum Hemorrhage (PPH) and other gynaecological emergencies.

Dr. Tariq Siddiqui, Director Oncology, Dr. Ziauddin Hospital, Dr. Talha Abdul Halim and Mr. Shaikh Farhan Chawla also addressed the audience. The event was attended by large number of participants including medical students, doctors, paramedical staff from different universities and hospitals.

ZIAUDDIN UNIVERSITY TAKES PROACTIVE APPROACH TO FIGHT AGAINST CANCER | WORLD CANCER DAY

In order to spread awareness about different types of cancer, Ziauddin University organised a seminar, 'Not Beyond Us' to mark World Cancer Day. The seminar focused on the barriers in cancer cure and the importance of screening and early diagnosis.

Criticising the government's priorities regarding health, Vice Chancellor Prof Dr Pirzada Qasim Raza Siddiqui said, "Only 1% of GDP is allocated for health care in Pakistan." Dr Quratulain Badar, Radiation Oncologist at Dr Ziauddin Hospital classified the barriers in patient related, doctor related and system related factors, and argued that lack of routine checkups, delay in diagnosis, financial crises, alternative medication and lack of qualified specialists are major obstacles to diagnosis and treatment of cancer.

Dr Najeeb Niamat Ullah, Consultant Medical Oncologist at Shaukat Khanum Memorial Cancer Hospital elaborated the financial impact of cancer. He analysed the relationship between health care expenditure and life expectancy. He quoted a study that says two percent of cancer patients were driven into bankruptcy by their illness and its treatment. "The

only way to cost effective health care is to say no to tobacco, eat vegetables and fruits, exercise regularly and sleep property." he said.

Prof Dr Abbas Zafar, Associate Dean at Ziauddin University spoke on the awareness and prevention of oral cancer. He stated that oral cancer is the sixth most common cancer in the world but it is rising rapidly in southern areas of Pakistan, particularly in Karachi. Dr Tariq Siddiqui, Director Oncology, Dr Ziauddin Hospital discussed the evolution of chemotherapy, types of prescriptions and how to make the right choices. Presenting the history of chemotherapy, he said "Chemotherapy is hijacked by infectious diseases, when antibiotics were used in treating infections." He advised cancer patients to have good quality tests, go to places where there are teams for treatment, keep their nutrients up and ask questions that concern them.

Dr Naila Zahid, Head of Oncology Department, Liaquat National Hospital stressed on screening and early diagnosis of cancer. Prof Dr Pirzada Qasim Raza Siddiqui praised the speakers for their valuable contribution in the field of medicine and urged students to volunteer for health campaigns.



ZU CATCHES ATTENTION AT 12TH DAWN EDUCATION EXPO

Hundreds of students interested in health sciences and media studies flocked to ZU stall as the University participated in the 12th DAWN Education Expo held on February 14-15, 2015 at the Expo Centre, Karachi. A delegation comprising faculty and students represented the university at the two-day event and introduced potential students to their colleges and programmes.

Anoushey Ashraf, renowned TV host expressed her concerns over the uncontrolled nature of social media. "If you want to make a difference or have something meaningful to share, social media is the best way to reach people." She advised the youth to stop spending time uselessly on social media. Fatir Siddiqui, blogger and social media specialist, highlighted how social media has encouraged citizen journalism during the past few years. He discussed the campaigns that brought the murderers of Shahzeb Khan to justice and urged the media students to use social media with responsibility.
