



8.5 - CME HOURS FOR SYMPOSIA & 3 - CME HOURS FOR WORKSHOP

Ziauddin University organized the 3-day International Conference "Bridging the Gap in Primary Health Care Innovations, Translations & Beyond......" The conference was attended by a large number of doctors, professors, educationists and medical students. The Chief guest Dr. Shabbir Ahmed Lehri, President Pakistan Medical and Dental Council (PMDC), and Principal, Bolan Medical College, Quetta said while addressing the inaugural session that the things are changing day by day epecially in medical technology due to issues relating to living habits. He further stated that ninety percent of private medical organizations are working in the country benefitting people and students but the other ten percent are just making money. Dr Lehri said that PMDC is to facilitate anyone who is going to operate on merit basis. We have to resolve your problem and issues and facilitate the doctors' community. He praised the Ziauddin University for being a national institution serving the country with dedication and international standards. He appreciated work and the efforts of the Ziauddin University adminis-

tration for arranging such an informative and useful conference. Dr. Maud Nauta the keynote speaker from Camden Health Improvement Practice, London UK in her address on "How and why we make mistakes. Lessons learned from the West", talked about human factors in primary health care. She shared examples of human factors like work load/ under load, lack of knowledge, pattern recognition, over confidence and said 100,000 people die in hospitals alone due to human error. She pointed out that first we have to find out our errors and then we would be able to solve them. Maud Nauta further stated that all health care professionals strive for improvement in patient care but at least 10% of patients admitted to hospitals encounter a potentially fatal medical error and 50% of these are preventable. Human factors or non-technical skills contribute to at least 70% of these errors, she said. "Harnessing the energy of health care workforce to benefit the community" was the subject discussed by Prof. Dr. Ghaffar Billo, Senior Professor of Pediatrics, Aga Khan University Hospital & Founder

of HANDS. He elaborated the functions of his NGO and talked about community empowerment. Earlier, Prof. Dr. Pirzada Qasim Raza Siddiqui, VC, Ziauddin University in his welcome address stated that Ziauddin University is a renowned institution of learning in Pakistan. 5TH INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON GYNAECOLOGY AND FETOMATERNAL MEDICINE

"There is a big distinction between obesity of western citizens and the people in our region. West's obesity is limited to upper parts of the body like shoulders while in Pakistan we face mostly abdominal obesity, reason is the difference of diet and the living style." Dr. Farid Zafar, President, Society of Obs & Gynae Pakistan (SOGP) said this while addressing as Chief Guest to the "5th International Symposium on Gynaecology and Fetomaternal Medicine" hosted by Ziauddin University, in collaboration with Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists.

Dr. Farid Zafar congratulated Professor Rubina Hussain for organizing such a purposeful event and appreciated the speakers for the high level and informative presentations on Gynaecology and Obstetrics in Pakistan. He said we want to collaborate with not only Royal College but other colleges of the world repute. The doctors are cream of the nation. He said genetics cannot be changed. We have to evolve our own guidelines and carry out the study on the rate of mortality in Pakistan. In Karachi and Lahore our rate of mortality is less than Larkana and other cities of rural areas not due to the doctors but living the style of the people. There is a variation between research personnel and the people operating in hospitals, he

The other speakers on the occasion included Professor Rubina Hussain, Dr. Tasneem Asalm Tariq, Dr Sumbul Sohail, Dr. Samrina Hashmi, and Professor Fouzia Perveen.

Professor Rubina Hussain, Chairperson, Department of Obstetrics & Gynecology of Ziauddin University, in her address highlighting the Premenstrual Syndrome (PMS) said it encompasses a vast array of psychological symptoms such as Depression, Anxiety, Irritability, Loss of Confidence and Mood Swings. She pointed out premenstrual exacerbation of an underlying disorder, such as; Diabetes, Depression Epilepsy, Asthma and Migraine. She advised that when treating women with severe PMS, CBT Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (Short term goal-oriented psychotherapy treatment) should be considered routinely as a treatment option. When treating women with PMS using

estradiol, women should be informed that there are insufficient data to advise on the long-term effects on breast and endometrial tissue. When treating a woman with PMS a holistic approach should be used and women should be managed on an individual basis. Still, you don't have to let these problems control your life. Treatments and lifestyle adjustments can help your patients reduce or manage the signs and symptoms of Premenstrual Syndrome, Prof. Rubina added.

Dr. Samrina Hashmi deliver her talk about 'Diabetes in pregnancy' stated that according to an estimate 21 million women or 16.2% of live births have some form of Hyper Glycaemia in pregnancy. Another 54 million women are affected by impaired glucose tolerance (IGT) with a potential to develop GDM if they become pregnant. Highlighting this issue Dr. Sumbul Sohail confronted the question "Are Our Women at Risk to Develop Metabolic Syndrome?" She disclosed that Pakistan is 9th most obese country in the world nearly 30 percent world's population is obese or overweight. Diabetes is highly prevalent, with Asia contributing to 60%. She recommended that health education should be embedded in school curriculums, and awareness should be extended to parents as well.

Dr. Tasneem Asalm Tariq (FRCOG), Consultant O&G from the UK offered her detailed presentation on the vital issue of 'Heavy Menstrual Bleeding (HMB)' that was highly informative based on the updated guidelines on the management of HMB.

Professor Fouzia Perveen addressed the most prevalent gynae-cological problem Polycystic Ovarian Syndrome she stated that it is a familial polygenic condition thought to be attributed to both genetic and environmental factors. Researches have inferred that genetics is the primary factor of this disease, and take unique approaches to understand this genotypic-to-phenotypic association. Genetic abnormalities have been shown to play a significant role in the metabolic complications (including IR), and appear among both male and female first-degree relatives of women with PCOS, she added.
