In the first phase, admissions of the College of Rehabilitation Sciences started its 5-years Doctor of Physical Therapy Program. On campus classes will

commence from January 2021.

In the second phase other colleges of Ziauddin University are also planning to open their sites at Sukkur.

Furthermore, Ziauddin University has been granted approval by the Sindh Cabinet to open its new campuses outside Pakistan and the management has decided to open new campuses in London and Dubai soon.



As compared to other Institutions, What makes Ziauddin Unique

We are the first formally announced Faculty of Nursing and Midwifery in the country and have an acronym ZUFON-AM. Ziauddin University College of Nursing is one the few to offer MSN program in the country. We are offering MSN with two specialized areas i.e. Education and Critical care areas.

ZUFONAM is also privileged to have an innate interest of the founders and their vision and commitment to nursing which provides a fertile ground and freedom to grow and develop.



An important aspect of our curriculum is community focus and the ZUFONAM is located in an area which is surrounded with under privileged communities which will provide rich experience for our students as well as give opportunities

to improve the health status of the population.

We have three distinguished leaders with national and international education and experience as members of the faculty who will enrich the programs, and provide role modelling for faculty and students.



We provide quality education as we have well qualified faculty members. We are enrolling 150 student nurses per year, which will help towards reducing nursing shortage.

What is state of Nursing currently in Pakistan?

- Pakistan is facing great nurses' shortage 0.7 /1000 population requiring 1.3 million nurses
- Pakistan Nursing Council and the government have declared entry to practice at Bachelor degree and RN diploma program to be phased out with last batch of admissions in 2018 to keep up with global trend.
- Midwifery, Lady Health Visitors and Female Welfare Workers education programs are being revised to upgrade to associate degree level of 3 years
- Education Standards for nursing and

midwifery programs are established in 2019

- Nursing Colleges are being established with public private partnership for BSN degree programs to meet the shortage of nurses
- Government is in process of planning and establishing a Nursing University, which will cater to 1000 students at a given time
- Scope of Practice for Midwives are established which allows for independent practice with permission of essential drug prescription
- Bridging program for upgrading from diploma to degree program
- Higher education for nursing in Pakistan is being promoted by increasing MSN (10 programs) and PhD (three programs) currently 230 MSNs and 10 PhDs
- Role of nurses is being expanded by initiating Advanced Nurse Practitioner program and Clinical Nurse Specialist which is work in progress
- Pakistan and Midwifery Council Act is being revised as per current requirements

I also had a privilege to represent Pakistan at numerous levels such as ICN, Nursing Christian Fellowship, IBTIDA, Sindh Nursing Examination Board, Nursing Council Idara-e-Aman-o-Insaaf. Dr. Syed Abid Mehdi Clinical Head, Department of Rehabilitation Science Clifton carried out by saying "We had to reconsider the whole treatment protocol and was physically and emotionally challenaina to send PTs to the fields knowing the seriousness of epidemic disease.

"FOOT AND ANKLE BIOMECHANICS AND THERAPEUTIC TAPING"

A webinar was conducted at Ziauddin College of Rehabilitation Sciences by Mr. Danish Rasool on 12th August 2020 titled as "Foot and ankle Biomechanics & Therapeutic Taping". In the webinar discussion was held on foot and ankle injuries being one of the most common injuries encountered by sportsman and healthy individuals around the globe. Understanding of foot biomechanics is vital in assessment and treatment of foot injuries. Especially, hindfoot has been found to play a key role in recurrent ankle sprain. Therefore, it is of great importance to understand these aspects while treating foot and ankle injuries. Sports taping along with exercises and mobilization is a good adjunct for rehabilitation purpose which is being practiced recently were practically discussed in the session. Importance of therapeutic taping was highlighted being helpful in preventing further injury and to regain normal function with less

discomfort. Hence, knowledge of biomechanics and use of sports taping is crucial for treating foot and ankle injuries.



VIRTUAL SEMINAR ON WORLD PHYSICAL THERAPY DAY "PEDIATRIC MENTAL HEALTH & OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY"

Children mental health is one of the most neglected domain which was highlighted by occupational therapy department of ZCRS in the webinar series conducted on 18th September 2020. An interactive session was hosted by Mr. Usman Khan, VP, and Sukkur campus and facilitated by Ms. Neelum Zehra, HOD occupational therapy, who discussed parental strategies, emotional status of children, and significance of psychosocial health and its impact of child mental health. 
The song was recorded at ZCOMS studio in which several students and faculty performed. It was released on the independence day and was well liked by the audience.





DIRECTORATE OF EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT ZIAUDDIN UNIVERSITY

From July to September2020; DED carried out multidisciplinary reviews (MDRs) for undergraduate and postgraduate programs of various faculties of Ziauddin University (refer appendix1. Accordingly an outcome of 2721 reviewed MCQs has been achieved for QBS-ZU along with 4PBLs.

DED also conducted 21 basic level workshops on Fundamentals of Educational Methodology (refer appendices 2 & 3).









COVID-19 brought with it many difficul-

ties not just for the health sector but also

for all the other domains, particularly the

education sector in Pakistan. The

pandemic forced universities to shift to

online classes, a challenge in and of

itself. The Ziauddin Faculty of Law took

the challenge head on and switched to

an entirely online semester. However, an

online session did not in any way

compromise the quality of lectures we

delivered nor did it dampen our spirit of

improving the student experience and



giving back to the society.

In July, ZFL established the Ziauddin Centre for Law & Technology. This was a first of its kind to be established in a national HEI. The Centre aims to contribute to the

future-centric narrative of techno-social (and subsequently techno-legal) emergence and growth and has four primary objectives.

- 1. Focus groups shall dissect and examine issues of technological importance, which shall subsequently aid in the creation of a regulatory mechanism.
- 2. Design technology-specific law modules for ZFL students to better acquaint them the latest in progress and innovation.

- 3. Organize focus group-based discussions and seminars (largely digital) which shall serve as a more hands-on learning and deliberation tool to make students and faculty aware of pertinent techno-legal problems and how professionals based in the EU and USA aim to counter them.
- 4. Educate and train the students of Ziauddin University in computer skills, pertinent software, and bringing them up to par with the 21st century tools of communication, business and academics

As the online semester came to an end in August and lockdown restrictions eased, ZFL prepared to welcome its Fourth Batch of students. Although life was gradually returning to normal, the

threat of a second COVID-19 wave was very much real. Thus, when the new semester began in September and on-campus activities resumed, ZFL adopted a blended learning approach and diligently followed all SOPs to ensure the well-being of both staff and students. Physical classes were combined with online lectures in an effort to have the least number of students on campus at any given point in time and reduce the risk of an outbreak through effective social distancing. Our classrooms and research rooms were equipped with computers and multimedia to support online learning, especially for those students who did not have a stable internet connection.

More good news came our way in September when ZFL became the first law school in Sindh to join IALS, an international forum established in the US. The International Association of Law Schools is a non-profit, collaborative, learned society dedicated to serving the worldwide legal education community. Working with other law schools, the principal mission is the improvement of legal education throughout the world by learning from other law schools. ZFL hopes to enrich faculty experience and student learning experience by partaking in both the Deans' Conference and the faculty exchange program where nearly 7500 faculty members from various member institutions participate. Moreover, under the banner of Ziauddin Law Clinic, students and faculty began to engage in pro bono legal consultation. The provision of free-of-cost legal advice not only serves the marginal and

underprivileged sections of our society but also provides opportunities for professional growth through experiential learning for our students. A similar opportunity is also provided by our Legal Incubation Centre which added an entrepreneurial twist to the quintessential legal education. The Incubation Centre provided an office space to young lawyers to set up their own private practice while giving our students the chance to engage in legal research and actual case work.

Despite the many challenges of these uncertain and unpredictable times, we at ZFL have remained committed to our vision of providing a quality legal education and a wholesome experience to our students; and shall continue so in the days to come.
